We are sure that K.M. College of Education would continue to make a significant contribution in educating the students in such a manner that they are to face the future challenges boldly in their life.

Suggestions:

- ➤ Value added programmes should be started.
- A committee should be made to publish the professional achievements of the Alumni.
- Alumni should take the responsibilities to make new and dynamic members who can work for the betterment of the College.
- > Duration of the B.Ed. course should be increased.

Curriculum of all the three courses has undergone changes in the last few years. The B.Ed. Syllabus was revised in 2010-11 to meet the requirements of the students, to impart quality education and to make the future teachers experts in their own field. Two theory papers and two community based projects were also introduced in the B.Ed. course curriculum in 2011-12. Internal Assessment has been made an integral part from session 2012-13 with a weightage of 20% in all papers. Out of 20 percent, 5% marks are for attendance, 10% marks are for Unit Tests and 5% marks are given for Assignments. In 2012-13 there are minor modifications in content of Paper VI & VII-Pedagogy papers and Community based projects-Paper VIIIB.

Following are the salient features of new syllabus:

- ➤ In year 1st, there would be 3 core papers, two pedagogy papers and 4 practicum papers for enhancing professional capacities of future teachers.
- ➤ In year 2nd, there would be 6 core papers, one optional paper with 4 elective options, 2 skill in teaching papers, school internship.
- ➤ There are Task & Assignments in all theory papers , engagement with field for two weeks every year.
- ➤ 20% weightage is given to-Internal Assessment in each theory paper
- ➤ Dr. (Mrs.) Anuradha was entreated with task of framing syllabus for Two papers-EP4: Understanding the self and paper IX(B): Understanding Discipline and Subject

The institution has introduced significant innovations in teaching learning material.

- Enrichment of syllabus is done by every teaching staff member in his/her teaching paper/subject.
- > Preparation of sample Micro lesson plans in each teaching subject.
- > Preparation of sample Mega Lesson Plans in each teaching subject.
- > Preparation & Delivery of content through self-learning modules in selected subjects.
- Making Action Research a compulsory part of school (Real) teaching programme.
- ➤ Use of Power Point Presentations and Multimedia DVDs for Teaching Learning.

Methods like Lecture–cum-Discussion, Demonstration, Laboratory, Project Work and inductive – deductive approach is used. Apart from this, students are provided with experiences through brain storming sessions, blended learning, cooperative learning, self-study, group discussion, seminar, extension lectures, ICT enabled teaching, project method and role play.

Blooms Taxonomy of objectives is the adopted for formulating objectives of the lesson.

Glaser's Basic Teaching Model, CAI-Computer Assisted Instruction, Enquiry Training Model, Mastery Learning Model are used to ensure effective learning of students.
